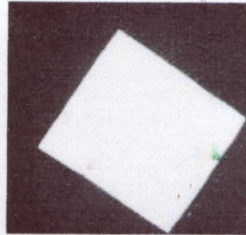
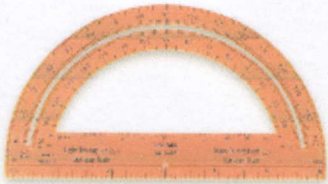

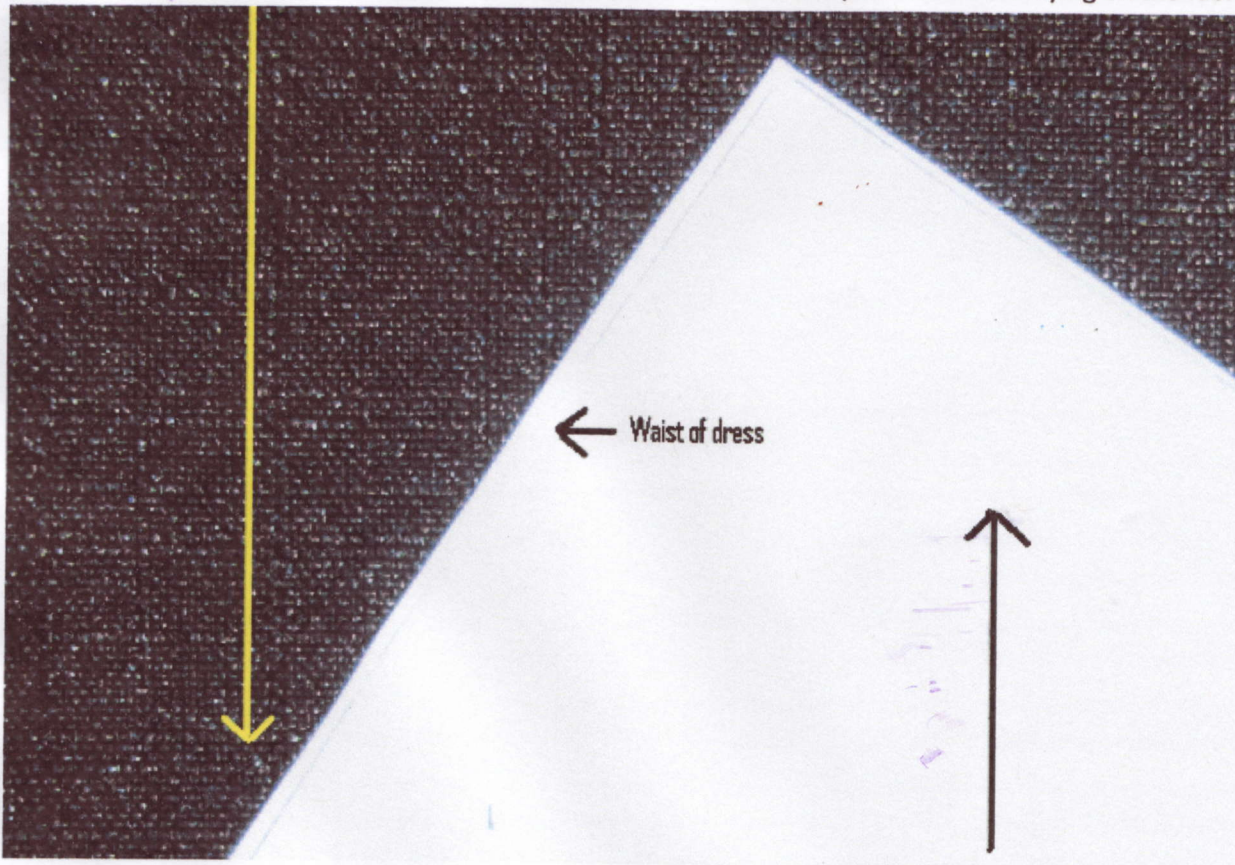
To start, let's not start with the fan and cut ourselves like I did, but cut the dress and the sleeves (2x) on the bias.

Make sure that it is exactly on the 45° angle or the fabric will pull in unwanted places.

Use a geometry set to check you have the right angle



Note on this enlargement the weave following the yellow line and the pattern of skirt laying on the fabric at a 45° angle



Use fraycheck along all sides of your rectangular piece of fabric and let dry.

Glue the backseam of the dress on the doll, I used a tiny strip of paper from the waist to her ankles and glued it on there, the rest was glued against her back.

Let this dry thoroughly. I left it overnight to make sure it is dry and well glued.

Once dry, apply a thin layer of glue next to the back seam, and let this set a little. I wait for my Ailene's to be tacky before I proceed, this will make it easier to glue the back of the dress together.
